It has outstanding standard features. Front disc brakes. Rack and pinion steering. A sporty interior. And a long, impressive list of additional standard equipment which you'll find on page 17.

Our 3-Door Runabout is especially versatile. It has a swing-up third door and a fold-down rear seat that creates a 29-cu.-ft. cargo area. Just toss in your gear and take off.

(A) Pinto 3-Door Runabout with Exterior Decor Group. With a new Tu-Tone treatment—shown in Bright Bittersweet (2G) over Dark Cordovan Metallic (8N). The Exterior Decor Group is available on the 2-door, 3-door Runabout and wagon. It adds a bright grille and headlamp doors, rocker panel and wheellip moldings. Plus accent stripes on the bodyside and (except wagon) on the rear.

(B) Pinto 3-Door Runabout with accent tape stripe. Shows you how easily you can add snap to Pinto's nimble lines with just a wide tape stripe on the Runabout or 2-door sedan. Runabout in White (9D).

(C) Electric rear window defroster.
Standard on all Pintos (except Pony) is this great convenience. The grid in the glass heats up to quickly clear away condensation, snow and ice. This metal-framed third door is standard on the Runabout. Optional is the all-glass third door shown in illustration B.

(D) Economical 2.3 liter engine.*
Pinto's spunky 4-cylinder engine has an efficient overhead cam design with a 5-main-bearing crankshaft. And it's easy on gas in the Pinto tradition.



Three sporty ways to dress up a bargain.

Rallye Pack, Cruising Package or ESS Option. Take your pick.

The Rallye Pack on the Runabout features a front spoiler. Rear spoiler with "Rallye" lettering tape. Black lower bodyside paint with "Rallye" lettering tape and narrow tricolor border tape. White-painted styled steel wheels with trim rings.

The Cruising Package stands out with its multicolor stripe treatment on the lower bodyside. And with its whitepainted styled steel wheels.

The ESS Option is available on both the Runabout and 2-door sedan. Its many black accents include the rocker panel and wheellip moldings, lower window ledge, and lower back panel. Also included are styled steel wheels with trim rings, ESS nomenclature, and premium bodyside molding.

Other sporty features of all three options on the Runabout are: charcoal grille and headlamp doors. Black window surround and greenhouse treatment. Dual black sport mirrors. All-glass third door with black hinges. And the Sports Package: sport steering wheel, instrumentation cluster (tachometer, ammeter, and temperature gauge), 3:08 performance axle with manual transmission.

Rallye Pack, Cruising Package also come in wagon versions (pages 12-13).





Economy-size street vans.

With today's emphasis on economy,*
here are three mini vans that are right
on target—two Cruising Wagons plus a
Rallye Pack—low-priced options with
all of Pinto's frugal ways.

As you can see, the Cruising Package comes two ways—with or without the new multicolor paint/tape treatment. Both also have black liftgate louvers.

The Rallye Pack wagon includes a front spoiler, black luggage rack, black paint on the lower bodyside and lower liftgate with a narrow, tricolor border tape. Plus "Rallye" lettering tape on the lower bodyside.

All three packages also include these features: charcoal grille and headlamp doors. Blackout paint treatment on the door frames, center door pillar, and on the windshield and backlight. Dual black sport mirrors. White-painted styled steel wheels with trim rings. Rear side windows replaced by inner and outer filler panels with portholes.

Inside, are a sport steering wheel and instrumentation (tachometer, ammeter, and temperature gauge). Plus color-keyed carpeting on the load floor and up on the inner filler panels.

- (A) Pinto Cruising Package with graphics. With a new design for 1980 in the blackout and colored stripe treatment on the upper quarter panel. Black rocker panel molding also included. Shown in Bright Yellow (6N).
- (B) Pinto Wagon with Rallye Pack.

Pinto's beautifully equipped inside, too.

Step into a Pinto and you step into an interior of style and comfort that's well designed for a small car. Standard are two high-back bucket seats up front and two bucket-style seats in back-seats that accommodate four people in comfort with ample shoulder room. And seats that are well contoured and foam padded to provide good support for legs and shoulders.

Ahead of the driver is a stylish instrument panel with two rectangular pods housing the highly visible speedometer and the large fuel gauge and warning lights. Right at hand is a floor-mounted shift (even with the optional SelectShift automatic). Plus a mini console with a handy storage bin. And a very conveniently located parking brake handle.

You also get color-keyed carpeting, a glove box, DirectAire ventilation, and continuous loop belts up front that swing down out of the way and against the pillar so rear seat passengers have unobstructed entry.

Standard, too, on all Pintos (except Pony models) are an AM pushbutton radio (may be deleted for credit), tinted glass, color-keyed instrument panel and steering wheel, and electric rear window defroster. See page 17 for a more complete list.

For 1980, there are handsome new fabrics and new interior colors: Medium Wedgewood Blue and Caramel-plus Black, Medium Red, and a new Medium Vaguero color choice for the optional Interior Decor Group.

What it all adds up to in a Pinto is a comfortable and attractive interior that's very livable.

- (A) Interior Decor Group-Cloth/Vinyl Low-Back Bucket Seats. Pinto's most luxurious interior is available in two seat trim choices: this handsome new striped fabric, in Caramel (DT), and all-vinyl. Either way, you get lowback bucket seats plus deluxe door trim, deluxe steering wheel, woodtone appliques on the instrument panel, parking brake handle, and shift knob (bezel on SelectShift). There's more: color-keyed belts with tension eliminator, day/night inside mirror, cigarette lighter, rear seat ashtray, deluxe sound insulation package, passenger door courtesy light switch, color-keyed parking brake boot, and color-keyed load floor carpet (Runabout and wagon).
- (B) Interior Decor Group-All-Vinyl Low-Back Bucket Seats. This is the all-vinyl selection for the Interior Decor Group option, which is standard on the Squire Wagon. Five colors to choose from, including Medium Wedgewood Blue (HB) shown here in soft vinyl.
- (C) Standard Interior-All-Vinyl High-Back Bucket Seats. This easy-to-clean vinyl with a wicker-weave pattern is available on the standard high-back bucket seats at no extra cost. Shown in Medium Red (AD) with Pony interior.
- (D) Runabout cargo space. One hand is all it takes to fold down the rear seat into a flat load floor that's five feet long with 29 cubic feet of cargo space.
- (E) Pinto instrument panel. Pinto's sporty panel has large rectangular instrument pods and graphics that make it easy to read. And it includes a glove box with door. Shown with Interior Decor Group.
- (F) Standard Interior-Cloth/Vinyl High-Back Bucket Seats.

FORD PINTO ENGINEERING

Here's where our Better Ideas for the 80's begin: AN INSIDE LOOK AT FORD PINTO

We've gone under the skin in this cutaway view to show you just a few of the engineering features that make Pinto such a strong performer and a great value.

A. 2.3 Liter OHC Engine. Pinto's 4-cylinder engine is a proven power plant with an overhead cam and shortstroke design for efficiency. It's easy on gas in the Pinto tradition.* DuraSpark Electronic Ignition is maintenance-free under normal use except for routine spark plug service. And there are no points or condenser to replace.

B. Independent Front Suspension. Coil springs and ball joints contribute to a total suspension design, which provides a surprisingly stable ride aided by a front stabilizer bar.

C. Front Disc Brakes. Resist fade because they dissipate heat quickly. And they're less affected by water than drum brakes.

D. Rack and Pinion Steering. It's similar to the type used on sports cars and delivers direct, responsive steering.

E. 4-Speed Manual Transmission. Floormounted and fully synchronized for fast, easy shifts.

F. Unitized Construction. Unitized platform/body saves on weight and is all-welded.

G. Roomy Interior. Pinto's interior is well-proportioned to seat four comfortably with ample shoulder and hip room. Wide door openings permit easy entry and exit.

H. Rear Suspension. Long, multileaf rear springs absorb load and road forces. Staggered shocks minimize wheel hop.

I. Steel-Belted Radial Ply Tires. Steelbelted radial ply tires are standard on every Pinto model. Another big value feature.


