TORINO Wind shaped. Made to move

Torino GT's and Cobras are graduates of the toughest finishing schools—Daytona, Darlington, Riverside, Galveston. These competitive tracks served as wind tunnels to shape Torino aero-dynamically, and as engineering labs to help us design stronger, more durable intermediates. Action-sized and action-minded, Torinos are among the quickest of any street machines ever offered. Torino GT's are handsome, luxury-loving cousins of the Cobra. But don't let all their glamour fool you. They are really performance cars and available in SportsRoof or Convertible models. They are equipped with a GT air-scooped hood,

E70-14 or F70-14 wide-tread white sidewall tires, special hub caps and trim rings, GT identification, and unique taillamps. Standard engine is the 302 CID V-8. The *Torino Cobra* (Sports-Roof) is downright wild and woolly. Standard equipment includes a 429 4V engine, competition suspension, quick-acting 4-speed manual transmission with Hurst Shifter, F70-14 wide-tread belted tires with raised white letters, 7" wheel rims, hub caps, black painted grille and hood, exposed hood lock pins, and Cobra decals on fenders and rear deck. Plenty of sassy options available, too. For details on Torino GT's and Cobras, ask for Ford's Performance Digest.

Fairlane 500 is Ford's traditional intermediate-size value car. It's styled and built like the Torino, which makes it more attractive than ever. Now, along with Fairlane's saving ways you get

the new-clear-through Torino concept, the wind-styled Torino shape, and monocoque Torino construction. Standard engine is the 250-cu. in. Six. Two body styles are offered—the 4-Door Sedan and the 2-Door Hardtop. The big 250 CID Six is standard on the Torino and Fairlane 500 Wagons. The 302 CID V-8 is standard on Torino Squire, optional on the others. And there are three other optional V-8's. Ford's 2-Way Magic Doorgate is also standard; it swings down for cargo and aside for people. The cargo floor is vinyl coated; up front there's carpeting for the Squire and Torino Wagon. Cargo floor length is 89" with the doorgate up and 109.5" with it down. However you measure them, these three all-new intermediate wagons are the last word in value. And the way to find out is to test-drive one first chance you get.
