And Twin Comfort Lounge Seats, a remote control right-hand rearview mirror, and luxury wheel covers, all illustrated.

Everything about the interior of the 1973 Lincoln Continental has been designed with maximum comfort in mind. The sedan, for example, actually gives rear seat passengers as much legroom as the driver.

Automatic Temperature Control is standard. So you can hold the interior temperature within the comfort range you select without any further manual adjustment.

Front and rear, the steel-frame, energyabsorbing seats are covered with polyurethane foam. And you can choose power bench seats or the optional individually adjustable Twin Comfort Lounge Seats, shown upper right.

There are two upholstery cloths available, trimmed with matching vinyls. You may also choose, at extra cost, the leather seating surfaces shown at the lower right. Matching extra-soft cowhides are sewn in a distinctive narrow pleat style.

Interior colors include white, dark blue, black, dark red, medium ginger, dark green, dark tobacco, gold, beige, and silver blue.

The Lincoln Continental instrument panel, in rosewood applique, is designed for maximum visibility and convenience.

Controls for Automatic Speed Control and the AM/FM multiplex stereo radio, both options at extra cost, both illustrated, typify the careful positioning of controls, gauges, and signal lights.

The 1973 Lincoln Continental Coupé. Also designed to be quieter and more comfortable than last year.

It has, in common with the sedan, one of the widest stances of any car in the world. And front suspension consisting of independent dual ball joints with spring loaded upper joints, helical coil springs, and double-acting shock absorbers.

The rear suspension is a three-link design with deep coil springs, shock absorbers, and a transverse track bar.

Tires are steel-belted radial ply for comfort, durability, and excellent roadholding characteristics.

These features give Lincoln Continental its extraordinarily comfortable ride and impressive handling characteristics.

As is the sedan, the coupé is a spacious car. Its carpeted luggage compartment is a very accommodating 18.1 cubic feet.

Luxuries such as two-way power seats and power windows are standard. Extra-cost options include the six-way power seats, vinyl roof, luxury wheel covers, and leather seating surfaces.

The Sure-Track Brake System is a very important option for you to consider.



And the interiors of the Continental Mark IV are every bit as beautiful as the exterior.



SURE-TRACK BRAKE SYSTEM—The computer-controlled Sure-Track electronic braking system is standard on Mark IV and optional at extra cost on Lincoln Continentals. This computer-controlled system improves braking stability by helping prevent sustained rear-wheel lockup on ice, snow or wet pavements. If driver brakes hard, Sure-Track's electronic monitors take over, automatically actuating and releasing the brakes (at 4 cycles per second) until car slows to 4 mph, or until brake is released by the driver.

Devices installed on 1973 Lincoln Continental and Mark IV vehicles are designed to reduce hydrocarbon emissions by 85%, carbon monoxide emissions by 69% and nitrogen oxides by 48% from pre-control levels on the average based on Federal test procedure.

Specifically, the bumpers meet 1973 Federal standards for up to 5 mph frontal impact protection and up to 2.5 mph rear impact protection straight into a flat, vertical fixed barrier without preventing normal operation of the car's latching, fuel, cooling and exhaust systems or of the propulsion, suspension, steering and braking systems. Tests show that, with bumper guards, no substantial damage to sheet metal should result from such a barrier impact at or below these speeds.
