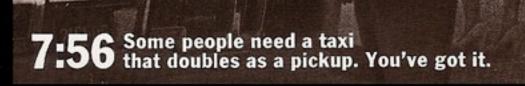
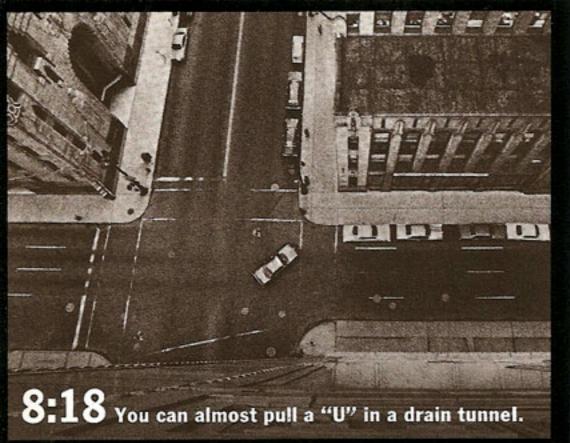

Thrift is the big word here. With single-barrel carburetor, automatic choke, short stroke design and economy-contoured camshaft. It's also got a fully counterweighted crankshaft and seven main bearings. Smooth.

Geared to Chevrolet's standard engines, exclusively, is our standard 3-Speed fully synchronized transmission. You can downshift into first without coming to a full stop. For safety, the clutch must be depressed before starting the engine. Nice touches.

Like we said, our kind of performance is everything working together.

For you.

Chevrolet's precision-built Ball-Race steering, for example. It lets you move through traffic with amazing agility.

You'll find this does, too: a curb-to-curb turning circle of only 42.5 feet. It's a lot of car to be turning so tight. 216 inches long. 119-inch wheelbase.

It's a lot of car. Like the room inside.

The rear seat alone is big enough for three full-size adults. Or two adults and a kid. Or one adult and two kids. Or three adults and three babes in arms. The combinations are endless. (Your passengers don't go through an obstacle course to get in and out, either. Wide doors open wide.)

Out back you've got over 18 cubic feet of usable trunk space. And if you charge by the suitcase, you'd better believe there's a lot in it for you.

That's why Chevrolet gives you this: big 15-inch wheels and bias belted ply tires. Full Coil suspension with double-acting shock absorbers and computer-selected springs.

Self-adjusting Safety-Master brakes. Just back up a

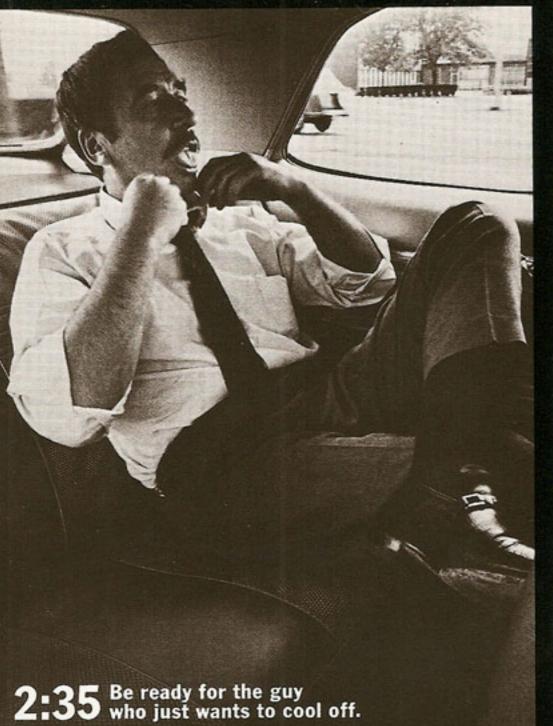

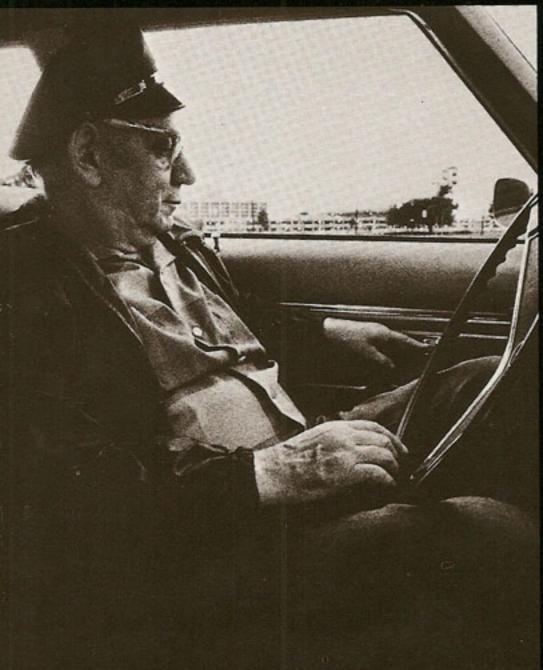
Delco Eye energizer battery. When the Delco Eye filler cap glows, you're low on solution. If not, more power to you.

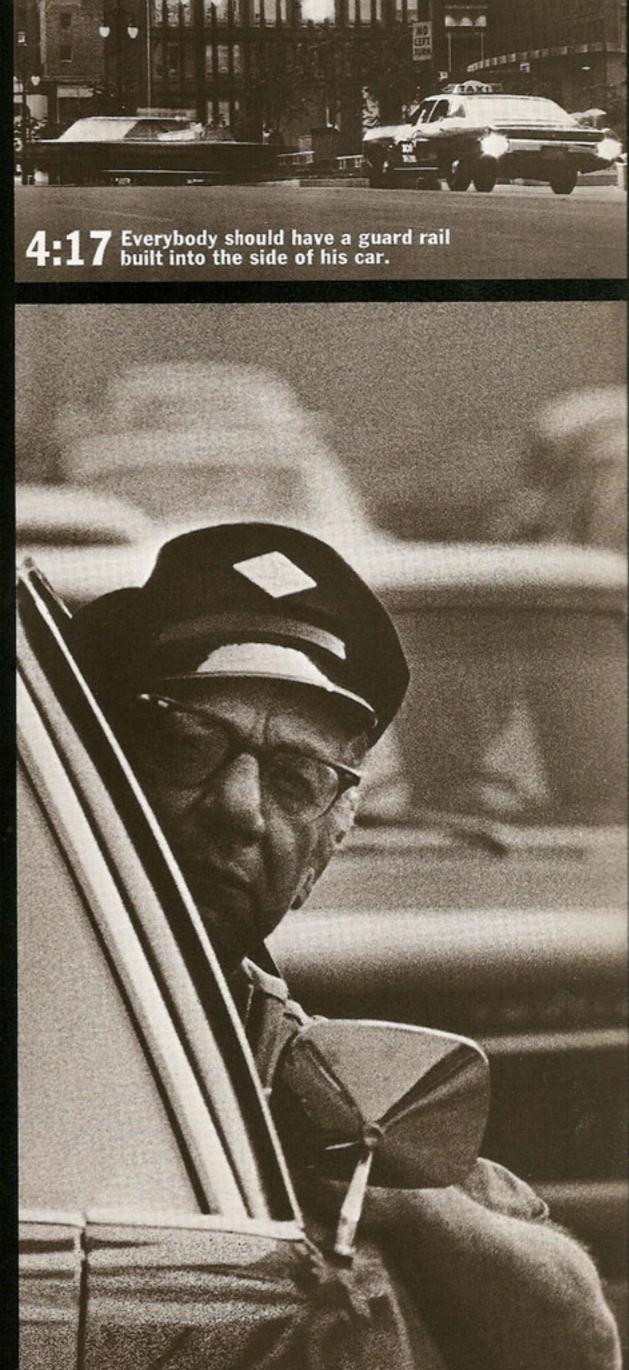
Topping it off is Chevrolet's Magic-Mirror acrylic lacquer finish. And that's a strong finish.

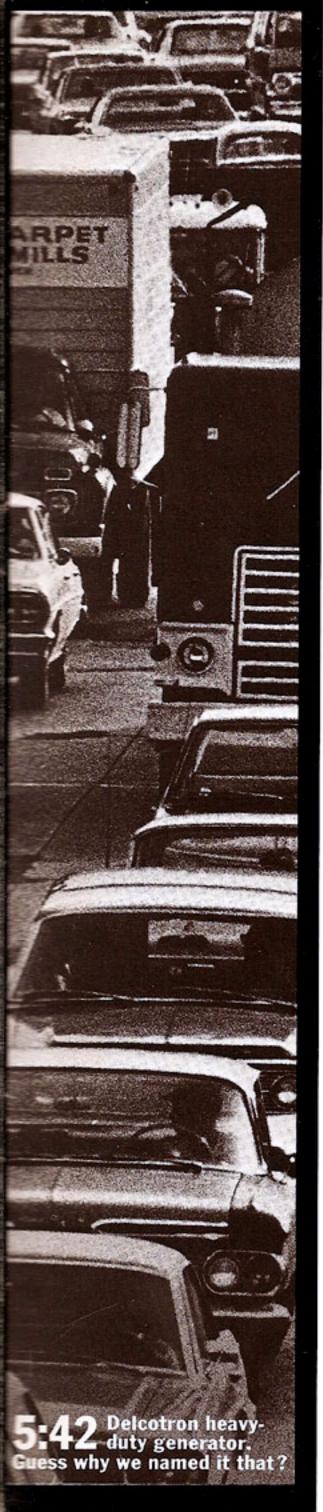

Extras for extra performance

The Big Chevrolet is a self-sufficient package. We've showed you that.

But if you want to order your convenience a little thicker, we'll show you how.

With our power door lock system. You press a button and lock or unlock all four doors. Instantly. Electrically. That's a pretty handy thing to have when you're cruising late at night.

With air conditioning. In addition to controlling temperature, our Comfortron or Four-Season air conditioning units remove up to 98% of airborne dust and pollen. (Available on special order with V8 engine.)

You know what they say about one good turn? That's variable-ratio power steering. It does up to 80% of the work through the turns. Back on the straightaway, you get big car handling.

Either Powerglide or Turbo Hydramatic transmissions take the work out of driving in heavy traffic. Powerglide is the smoothest two-speed you never shifted. The three-range Turbo Hydramatic offers complete gear versatility for any driving condition.

Consider power disc brakes. Calipertype disc brakes at the front wheels make for quick, straight stops with minimum fade.

Body Equipment

You get heavy-duty springs in front and rear seats. Heavy-duty low-profile front seat with thick foam cushion. Front and rear rubber floor mats. Automatic front and rear door switches for dome lights. Open-door warning light on instrument panel operated by switches at all doors. Two 12-gauge wires routed from above the dome lamp to underneath the instrument panel; 24 inches of wire coiled under the roof panel, 36 inches of wire coiled and taped to the firewall at the car's centerline.

Chassis Equipment

Special heavy-duty frame with reinforced front upper control arm brackets. Heavy-duty front and rear springs and shock absorbers. Metal-lined spherical joints for front suspension. Special front and rear brakes with heat-resistant brake shoe retracting springs, extra-thick premium brake lining material. Larger 8%"-diameter ring gear. High-torque capacity axle shafts and roller-type wheel bearings plus additional rear suspension upper control arm for 6-cylinder engine models. Special 3.07:1 or 2.73:1 rear axle ratios.

6-Cylinder Engine Equipment

Aluminized inlet and exhaust valves. Heavy-duty distributor. Extra-durable compression and oil-control piston rings. Hardened-tip valve pushrods. Large 14"-diameter flywheel ring gear (standard 3-Speed transmission only).

Starter features special road-splash sealing. Take-apart engine ventilation valve. High-capacity 11"-diameter diaphragm clutch (standard 3-Speed transmission only). Heavy-duty 61-amp.-hr. 12-volt Energizer battery. Heavy-duty lower rear crankshaft main bearing for models with automatic transmissions. 42-amp. Delcotron generator.

V8 Engine Equipment

Aluminized inlet and exhaust valves. Extra-durable compression and oil-control piston rings. Hardened-tip valve pushrods. Valve rotators. Special hydraulic valve lifters, rocker arms, and rocker arm balls.

Powerglide automatic transmission equipment

113/4" heavy-duty converter. Additional clutch plate. Larger gearset. High-cooling-capacity radiator with built-in transmission oil cooler for 6-cylinder models.

Turbo Hydra-matic transmission equipment

Additional clutch plates and heavyduty radiator for 6-cylinder models. Plus extra-firm shift for V8 models.

Big Chevrolets are equipped with the most advanced safety features offered.

You get: Side-guard beams. Front seat head restraints and energy-absorbing steering column. Seat belts with pushbutton buckles for all passenger positions. Shoulder belts with pushbutton buckles for the driver and right front passenger. Passenger-guard door locks with forward mounted lock buttons. Yielding windshield pillar moldings. Safety door latches and hinges. Energy-absorbing instrument panel and front seat back tops. Contoured windshield header. Thick-laminate windshield. Padded sun visors. Safety armrests. Safety steering wheel and cargo-guard luggage compartment.

These, too: side marker lights and reflectors. Parking lights that illuminate with the headlights. Four-way hazard warning flasher. Backup lights. Lane-change feature in direction signal control. Windshield defroster, washers and dual-speed wipers. Wide-view inside day-night mirror (vinyl-edged with shatter-resistant glass and deflecting support). Outside rearview mirror. Bias belted ply tires with tire tread wear indicators. Dual master cylinder brake system and warning light. Starter safety switch. Dual-action safety hood latches. Open-door warning lamp on the instrument panel.
