

Dynaride results in excellent isolation of road irregularities and-remarkablyeliminates the need for some heavy-duty suspensions.

The new world class 3.8 SFI 3800 V-6

The standard engine for all 1988 Electra sedans is the brand new, transverse-mounted 3800 V-6, a premium 3.8-litre engine with sequential-port fuel injection. The 3800 V-6, with its counterrotating balance shaft, lightweight alloy pistons and roller valve lifters works with a commendable quiet smoothness entirely appropriate to the Electra. In all Electras, the 3800 is mated to an automatic transmission with overdrive, a combination that delivers the strong, swift performance expected by drivers who select premium automobiles as transportation.

The engine's fuel injection system, the most advanced and efficient yet offered by Buick, was developed by General Motors engineers working with Bosch of Germany, an acknowledged leader in the field. The new engine carries a horsepower rating of 165, a ten percent increase over its predecessor.

The 3800 incorporates

sophisticated electronics. A Computer Controlled Coil Ignition (C31) maintains the engine's finely calibrated ignition sequence, and a mass air-flow sensor monitors the engine's air intake electronically, adjusting the mixture of air and fuel in a continuous effort to ensure optimum operation.

Anti-lock brake system

Because even fine automobiles are often called upon to serve under poor and even threatening road conditions, a word about the remarkable anti-lock brake system offered by Buick is in order.

Available on all 1988 Electras and standard on the T Type, the electronic anti-lock braking system is a major forward step in providing the driver with better control of a vehicle during braking. Each

a sensor that monitors the speed of that wheel and conveys the data to a microprocessor. Should the sensor indicate electronically that the wheel is about to lock up, the microprocessor adjusts the braking at that wheel to compensate for conditions.

Think of it as pumping the brakes-individually for each front wheel and simultaneously for the rear wheels-to the point of maximum efficiency: the point just prior to lock-up.

The system can release and apply hydraulic pressure at a rate of up to 15 times per second and can vary the rate at each wheel. The result of this anti-lock brake system is the vehicle stopping in the shortest possible distance consistent with maintaining driver control, even on wet and icy road

For the driver who yearns for a more performance-oriented Buick, we recommend the Electra T Type, a car completely equipped for serious drivers. The T Type includes as standard the firm Gran Touring suspension, anti-lock brakes, a leather-wrapped steering wheel, 45/45 front seats, both center and overhead consoles and aluminum wheels with P215/65R15 Eagle GT+4 blackwall radials. The Electra Limited and Park Avenue sedans offer a touring option package that merits consideration: the Gran Touring Package, based on the firm suspension found in the Electra T Type.

Once the body has been handsanded, it enters an automated paint chamber where a squad of robots circles the body, spraying interior and exterior surfaces, opening and closing the doors automatically as they work their silent, programmed magic.

In all, every Skylark receives two coats of color enamel atop the primer and primer/surfacer, plus two further coats of clear acrylic enamel. The result is the extraordinary Buick finish-deep, lustrous, handsome and backed up by General Motors 6-year/ 60,000-mile limited warranty which includes 6-year/100,000mile corrosion protection.
