




Imperial is also longer than any sixpassenger '64 Cadillac. And only Imperial's shoulder room and hip room exceed five feet, both front and rear. Yet for all this extra space, we honestly don't know of anyone who has ever complained about Imperial's handling ease.

The new Imperial presents a level of quality rarely achieved in automotive history.



Imperial's brake lining area is the largest by far—25% larger than that of any other American luxury car. Its basic automatic transmission principles—

3-speed planetary gear set with torque converter—were first adopted nine years ago; they were introduced by Cadillac in 1964. Our torsion-bar suspension is still exclusive. ■ Imperial's materials are usually above the standards for its field. Its leathers are not simply top-grain; they are prime grade top grain. Carpeting is used in the trunk. Genuine rosewood is used for the wood inlays in LeBaron models. And so on. ■ Finally, the individual Imperial you drive is meticulously built to meet the

test of three corps of inspectors and 1,650 quality-control checks—in the final assembly phase alone.




Imperial's warranty.

*Here's how Chrysler Corporation's 5-year/50,000-mile warranty protects you: Chrysler Corporation confidently warrants all of the following vital parts of its 1964 cars for 5 years or 50,000 miles, whichever comes first, during which time any such parts that prove defective in material and workmanship will be replaced or repaired at a Chrysler Motors Corporation Authorized Dealer's place of business without charge for such parts or labor: engine block, head and internal parts, intake manifold, water pump, transmission case and internal parts (excepting manual clutch), torque converter, drive shaft, universal joints, rear axle and differential, and rear wheel bearings. REQUIRED MAINTENANCE: The following maintenance services are required under the warranty—change engine oil every 3 months or 4,000 miles, whichever comes first; replace oil filter every second oil change; clean carburetor air filter every 6 months and replace it every two years; and every 6 months furnish evidence of this required service to a Chrysler Motors Corporation Authorized Dealer and request him to certify receipt of such evidence and your car's mileage. Simple enough for such important protection. The warranty on all other parts manufactured or supplied by Chrysler Corporation is for 12 months or 12,000 miles, whichever occurs first, excluding only tires and normal maintenance services such as replacing spark plugs, condensers, ignition points, filters, et cetera.
