Our prices may be down around the low-priced cars, but that's all that is.



1968 Chrysler Specifications

A few thousand words for the man who'd like to know why his Chrysler will be worth more if he ever decides to sell it.

Body Construction: All structural steel frame members, body braces, sills, and metal panels that make up the body have been welded into a single unit. There are over 5,000 individual welds in each Unibody. The result is a solid shell of unusual strength—and silence. Once welded together, all Unibodies are dipped and sprayed 6 times in a series of cleaning, rinsing, and rust-inhibiting chemical baths. A 7th step is immersion in a special corrosion-resistant primer that covers both inside and outside of all lower body sheet metal and structural members.

Brakes: All Chryslers have a dual braking system, one for front wheels, the other for rear wheels. If a hydraulic leak or malfunction should develop in one system, the other serves as a back-up. A warning light on the instrument panel notifies the driver whenever pressure or brake fluid is low in either system.

The parking brake is connected to cables that apply the rear wheel brakes. A warning light notifies drivers when the parking brake is on. Chrysler brakes are self-adjusting whenever they are applied while transmission is in reverse. Chrysler brakes are also the largest standard brakes in the low or medium price class. Effective lining area is 223.4 sq. in. for Newports and Newport Customs, 234.1 sq. in. for all other models. Optional front disc brakes are available on all Chryslers. Total swept area is 437.1 square inches.

Cleaner Air System: This system of engine exhaust emission control provides for a more complete burning of the fuel-air mixture in combustion chambers, and consequently a reduction of unburned hydro-carbons and carbon monoxide concentrated in the exhaust system. The Cleaner Air System consists primarily of: a slightly altered distributor, to retard spark at idle; a modified carburetor for lean fuel/air mixture at part throttle; and other modifications to the combustion chamber design, induction system and exhaust system.

Cooling System: Chrysler's radiator and block, including heater, have a 17 quart

coolant capacity (18 quart with 440 engine).
A thermostatic by-pass control and pressure vent radiator cap regulate temperatures automatically.

Electrical System: Chrysler's 12-volt battery is rated at 59-ampere-hours. (70-ampere-hours with 440 engine). Alternator is rated at 37 ampere. Electric windshield wipers are standard. 2-speeds on Newport, Newport Custom, 330. 3-speeds on Town & Country and New Yorker.

Engines: Chrysler's standard and optional engines are advanced-design, overhead valve V-8s. Combustion chambers are wedge-shaped for efficient fuel burning. Pistons are lightweight aluminum, with steel struts for heat expansion control. Connecting rods and crankshaft are of forged steel. Tappets are operated hydraulically. Exhaust valves of hardened steel-alloy are heat resistant, and rotate to equalize wear and extend valve life. Cleaner Air System reduces air pollution, keeps vital engine parts cleaner.

Mufflers and tailpipes on all engines are aluminized to resist corrosion. (See engine chart below.)

Fuel System: Fuel flow is governed by an automatic choke and mechanical fuel pump on all Chryslers. Tank capacity is 22 gallons on Town & Country models, 24 on all other Chryslers.

There are two fuel filters. A woven plastic 40-micron filter in the gasoline tank, and a replaceable 15-micron paper filter in the fuel line between fuel pump and carburetor.

Transmission and Rear Axle: A 3-speed manual transmission is standard on Newports and Newport Custom. Outside clutch diameter is 11". The release bearing is a permanently lubricated ball bearing type. Second and third gears are synchronized for smooth, silent upshifting. Synchronizer springs are stainless steel.

The TorqueFlite automatic 3-speed transmission is standard on Town & Country, 300, and New Yorker, and is optional on Newport and Newport Custom. TorqueFlite's torque converter is water-cooled. It combines with a balanced 3-speed gear assembly to provide continued smooth and economical shifting. Special transmission oil, installed at the

factory, stays thin at low temperatures to provide easier cold-weather starting and smoother operation.

Suspension and Handling: Torsion-Aire suspension consists of 2 chrome-steel torsion bars up front, and leaf springs in the rear. The result is a level and responsive ride in all driving maneuvers.

A sway bar in front helps body resist lean.
Diagonally-mounted steel struts reinforce the
front wheel lower control arms. These arms
are slightly angled to prevent front-end
"dip" during hard braking. Shock absorbers
are hydraulic, double-action type.

There are $5\frac{1}{2}$ rear cushion leaf springs in each rear spring assembly on Newports and Newport Customs, $6\frac{1}{2}$ on all other models.

registered owner the engine block, head and internal parts, intake manifold, water pump, transmission case and internal parts (except manual clutch), torque converter, drive shaft, universal joints, rear axle and differential, suspension system (except shock absorbers), steering gear and linkage system, wheels and wheel bearings of its 1968 automobiles for 5 years or 50,000 miles, whichever occurs first, and warrants to the first and second registered owners the entire vehicle (excluding tires) for 24 months or 24,000 miles, whichever occurs first, against defects in materials and workmanship and will repair or replace such defective parts without charge for parts or labor at any Imperial, Chrysler, Plymouth or Dodge Authorized Dealer's place of business. Maintenance such as replacement of spark plugs, condensers, ignition points, filters, brake and clutch lining, etc., and normal deterioration of hoses, belts, upholstery, soft trim and appearance items is not included. Maintenance services required under the warranty are: change engine oil every 3 months or 4,000 miles, whichever occurs first, and replace oil filter every second oil change; check operation of crankcase ventilator valve and clean oil filler cap every 6 months and replace ventilator valve every year; clean carburetor air filter every 6 months and replace every 2 years; lubricate front suspension ball joints and tie rod ends at 3 years or 36,000 miles, whichever occurs first; and every 12 months (A) have an authorized Imperial, Chrysler, Plymouth or Dodge dealer certify on an approved Warranty Validation form (i) receipt of evidence of performance of the required services and (ii) the car's then current mileage, and (B) the owner must submit such completed form to Chrysler Motors Corporation.
