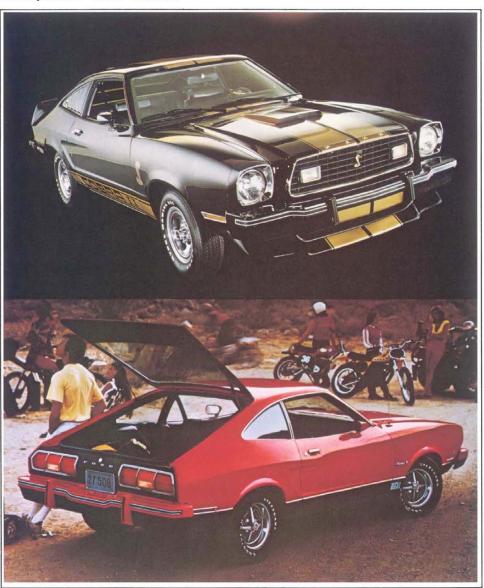
Mustang II Cobra II: Driving excitement lives again!

In 1965 Carroll Shelby introduced the performance world to a machine that was to become a legend: the Shelby Cobra. Based on Mustang's solid roadability, the Cobra included refinements that made it one of road racing's most popular and overwhelming performers. Now, welcome the 1976 Cobra II, a today version of its forebearer with the same looks and "make something happen" appearance.

And Cobra II "happens": bold racing stripes, blackout grille, racing mirrors, quarter window louvers, front air dam, decklid spoiler, brushed aluminum instrument panel and door appliques, Cobra insignia. On the road, Cobra II puts down styled steel wheels with Cobra logo and trim rings, plus BR70 steel-belted radials. Colors? White-and-blue or the new black-and-gold look. Cobra II: Uncoil one!
