



During your sales presentation, it's extremely important to stress the following Five Key Reasons To Buy Grand Marquis:

Warranty Changes

As you know, warranty changes became effective on all 1991 model year Mercury vehicles delivered on or after September 4, 1990. In brief review, the Mercury vehicle changes include:

- The 6-year/60,000-mile powertrain coverage has been revised to 4 years or 50,000 miles, whichever occurs first
- The deductible fee for powertrain components has been reduced from \$100 to \$50 per repair visit after the 12-month/12,000-mile basic coverage period
- All other warranty coverage remains the same

The Grand Marquis Advantages

Be sure to tell your customers about these warranty changes, and emphasize that they give Grand Marquis advantages over Caprice in two ways:

- Grand Marquis's Powertrain warranty coverage lasts one year longer . . . 4 years/50,000 miles vs. 3 years/50,000 miles
- Grand Marquis's deductible for powertrain repairs after the initial 12-month/12,000-mile basic period is \$50, compared with Caprice's \$100 deductible

1992 Grand Marquis Competition

The full-size car segment represents a strong and traditional marketplace for domestic manufacturers. Even through recessional years, the full-size car segment has held a specific niche in today's car buying marketplace.







WHAT ARE PEOPLE SAYING ABOUT THE 4.6L V-8?

"The Romeo (4.6L engine) is 40 pounds lighter than the pushrod engine it replaces, is only half as noisy, is more fun to drive, pollutes less and goes about 1.5 miles pollutes less and goes about 1.5 miles farther on a gallon of gas. And — wave the farther on a gallon of gas. And — wave the flag — it finally puts a big U.S. engine in the same league as those that power the the same league as those that power than Japanese luxury mobiles, Lexus and Infiniti. Who says you can't have it all?"

Optional on the Grand Marquis is an anti-lock braking system. The ABS system senses wheel skid and rapidly modulates braking pressure to inhibit lockup. This helps:

- The driver to steer under adverse weather conditions such as slippery or wet surfaces
- Improve stopping distance on wet surfaces
- Maintain steering control and stability under full braking

Although Caprice offers standard ABS, the Grand Marquis system employs 4-wheel disc brakes, which are able to modulate (engage and release) faster than the disc/drum system.

Included with the Grand Marquis ABS system is the electronic traction assist system. Traction assist utilizes the brakes to help keep the drive wheels from spinning. For example, when accelerating on a slippery surface, the system will prevent the rear wheels from spinning, assisting the driver to stay in control.
