Easy parking and sure cornering with a tight turning radius (14'5").

Deluxe models (including Sport) have a split rear seat (1) and (2). So you can fully utilize your space for carrying people and/or stuff.

They have a remote electric hatch release (3), at your fingertips.

And look at all the space that opens up (4.) Enough for saddles and camping gear, said one owner.

Now, our new GLC Sport has all this, plus its own added flair. Like wide tires (all-steel radials), snazzy striping, special instrument panel including a tach, and real-wood steering wheel.

GLC Deluxe models improve your outlook with a rear washer, wiper and defroster. (The Standard model comes with a rear defroster only.) (5).

GLC combines frisky performance from a 1300-cc OHC piston engine with great big mileage. EPA rating, 46 mpg (highway), 35 mpg (city).\*

And you have three transmissions to consider. Four-speed, standard on most models. Five-speed, standard on the Sport, optional on other Deluxe models. And automatic (available at extra cost in certain states; not available on Sport model). Radios shown are optional.
