

The Fleetwood Sixty Special Sedan, above, is the finest expression of Cadillac's dramatically new styling, with remarkable elegance of line and form. Its new forward-sweeping grille, flowing side contours and bold, clean rear design lend majesty to its exclusive longer length. Its sixteen exterior colors and five optional Firemist finishes are complemented by an impressive choice of twenty-one interiors in cloth, leather and cloth, or leather. A generous selection of power assists, including power operated vent windows, front and rear, automatic level control and many other convenience features are provided as standard equipment. Here, indeed, is Fleetwood excellence at its fullest. A distinctive padded roof, with wreath and crest and Brougham script embellishment instantly marks the car shown on the opposite page as the Fleetwood Brougham. The sleek horizontal lines of the new rear design are framed by a unique taillight assembly. This model offers a total of twenty-one cloth, cloth and leather, or leather choices. 

Shown at the right is the rear compartment of the Fleetwood Brougham. It combines black Diplomat design cloth and genuine leather. Some of the exclusive features of the Brougham are folding rear compartment footrests, two fold-down vanity trays on the front seat back and two individual swivel type reading lamps for the rear seat passengers.

















The Coupe de Ville offers a selection of nineteen interiors in leather or cloth and leather. The interior shown at the left features the leather option in a rich, medium blue. Two cloth and perforated leather patterns are available, and leather bench or bucket seats are optional.

The glamour of the De Ville convertible is further dramatized by the excitement of its interiors. Thirteen leather interiors are offered when the bench seat is selected. Four leather interiors, including the black leather, shown at the right, are available with the bucket seat option. Leather is perforated to "breathe" for extra comfort.










The Sedan de Ville interior, shown at the left in Medium Beige Duchess cloth and leather, is one of seventeen leather or cloth and leather choices.

The Hardtop Sedan de Ville, shown at the right in Medium Aqua Darien cloth and leather, is available in a total of nineteen leather or cloth and leather choices, including two bucket seat options.





1. The Cadillac instrument panel for 1967 is handsome, functional and richly window control can be locked from the driver's control panel. (Power windows are appointed. 





- 2 With bucket seats, you may also select a reclining right front seat with adjustable headrest. The reclining seat is also available on the Eldorado with bench seat.
- 3 Automatic climate control maintains a preselected temperature automatically. The system can be bypassed by a new vent position for filtered outside air.
- 4 Cruise Control permits setting and maintaining a desired speed without using the accelerator pedal. It also acts as a speed reminder by a gentle back pressure to the accelerator when selected speed is reached.
- 5 All doors can be locked or unlocked from either front door, a feature especially appreciated by Cadillac families.
- 6 Twilight Sentinel automatically turns lights on and off according to light conditions and can be set as you leave the car to keep lights on up to ninety seconds, for a path of light at night.
- 7 Tilt and Telescope steering wheel adjusts in four directions for personal comfort and swings up for easier entry and exit.



- **8** A padded vinyl roof is standard in five colors on the Brougham and available on De Ville closed models, the Seventy-Five series and the Eldorado.
- 9 The Cadillac AM Radio has superb tone with wide bass or treble adjustment. Sound may be directed through front or rear speaker or both. Tuning is manual by pushbutton, or automatic with signal bar selector.
- 10 AM-FM Radio adds the enjoyment of fine FM and features two speakers, automatic frequency control and an automatic antenna which is standard with all Cadillac radios.
- 11 The Cadillac AM-FM Stereo Radio brings you the full richness of stereo FM. Two speakers in front and two in the rear are cross-balanced—left front with right rear and right front with left rear—for true stereo sound for driver and passengers.
- 12 Adjustable front seat headrests are available for both bench type seat, above, and bucket seats, below.
- 13 Six-way power seat control gives horizontal, vertical and angle adjustment for maximum comfort.

Engine: Eight-cylinder, 340 HP, overhead, 90° V-type; bore 4.13", stroke 4.0": displacement 429 cu. in. Max. torque 480 ft.-lbs. Engine mounted in rubber at three points. Compression ratio 10.5 to 1.

Pistons: Aluminum alloy, slipper type to reduce friction surfaces and permit nesting between crankshaft counterweights. New top compression ring inverted to pump oil upwards rather than down, one wide oil ring with expander: top compression ring molybdenum-filled to minimize wear on cylinder walls. Contoured piston head increases turbulence for fast, complete burning of fuel-air mixture.

Carburetor: New Quadrajet four-barrel downdraft with equalized manifold; mechanical fuel pump; dry type air filter;

GasolineTank Capacity: Approximately 21.5 gallons, Eldorado approximately 20.

Turbo Hydra-Matic: Fully automatic, improved torque converter type with variable stator (except Seventy-Five models). Converter multiplies engine torque for increased driving thrust to drive wheels during acceleration in any gear (low. intermediate or high).

Rear Axle: Hypoid, Differential housing offset to provide straight-line drive. Ratio is 2.94 with a 3.21 axle available (3.21 only on Eldorado). The 3.21 axle is standard on all air-conditioned models and the Seventy-Five models. Available (except Eldorado) is the controlled differential which directs power to rear wheel having better traction.

Front Suspension: Spherical joint with Cadillac independent, helical-coil-type springs. Rubber mounted strut rods and rubber bushings absorb impacts and isolate road noise. (Torsion bar suspension on Eldorado.)

Rear Suspension: Four-link drive. Rear springs are helical-coil-type. Rubber bushings for quieter, softer ride. (Single leaf springs with two horizontal and two vertical shock absorbers on Eldorado.)

Brakes: Cadillac power brakes with selfadjusting shoes; finned front and composite finned rear drums. Split hydraulic master cylinder provides independent piston and fluid reservoir for front and rear brakes.

Frame: Perimeter frame is fully boxed in its entire length with hidden bulkheads for additional torsional rigidity. Eldorado has a frame especially designed for its front wheel drive and front and rear suspension systems.

Tires: Low pressure, 2-ply tubeless, size 9.00 x 15 on all models except the Fleetwood Seventy-Five, on which the size is 8.20 x 15, 4-ply, Black sidewalls are standard on all models. White sidewalls may be selected on all models.

Cornering Lights: (standard equipment On the side of front fenders, activated by directional signal lever when head lamp switch is on. Project a beam of light from the side of the car, thus illuminating roadside and road signs for extra convenience at night.




