The legendary Land Cruiser has made its mark on the world. From the Australian Outback to beyond the Arctic Circle, from the Hindu Kush to the Grand Tetons, the indomitable Land Cruiser goes where lesser vehicles have little chance of getting through.

And the truly amazing thing about the 1981 Land Cruiser is that it is capable of conquering hostile environments and forbidding terrain just as it comes

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from the showroom, without special equipment or modifications. The off-road necessities for serious fourwheeling are standard equipment. Steel skid plates protect the transfer case and fuel tank. There's a front tow hook, steering stabilizer, and even rear doors for easy access to the flip-up rear seats or off-roading gear.

Land Cruiser's boonie-beating power comes from a proven and reliable 4.2 liter 6-cylinder engine that puts up to 200 ft./lbs. of torque through the 4-speed synchromesh transmission and 2-speed transfer case to the 6-spoke white steel wheels.

A tandem master cylinder system with power-assisted brakes – front discs and rear drums – provides the stopping power. You don't even have to supply a roll bar: there's one already built in. If a 1981 Toyota Land Cruiser can't get you where you want to go, think twice about going.

Now there's a Land Cruiser with room for five adults and a full complement of camping and sports gear. The new, stylish 1981 Wagon is Land Cruiser tough, ready to leave the pavement behind and strike out for the back country where only wild critters and 4x4s roam. Free-wheeling front hubs let you ride the roads in 2-wheel drive, then lock into 4x4 in the rough.

On the pavement or off, its aggressive, rugged styling turns heads. The 6-spoke chrome steel wheels sport big, tough, mud and snow tires. Chrome bumpers, grille, and headlight rims make this Land Cruiser more than a match for any wadon in the looks department.

Inside, the treatment is first class to lend a softer touch to your rough off-roading. A tilt steering wheel adjusts to your preferred position, and power steering is a real arm saver. Individually reclining front bucket seats let you call the shots when it comes to comfort. Front and rear heaters, full carpeting, luxury door trim, even full instrumentation are just a few of the standard features that make the new 1981 Land Cruiser Wagon a very out-of-the-ordinary four-wheeler.

STANDARD FEATURES

Land Cruiser's 4-speed synchromesh transmission and 2-speed transfer case combination give you the gearing you need for any terrain, from low rpm highway cruising to high-torque slogging through the deep stuff. Spoked steel wheels give both Land Cruisers a no-nonsense off-road vehicle look. A white fiber glass roof (Hardtop only) reflects the heat. Opening rear guarter windows (Hardtop only) let in the breezes for comfort in hot weather. A high-output heater/defroster keeps you comfortable in polar bear weather. And because you can be a long way from a Toyota mechanic when you go off-road, there's even a tool kit for emergency fixes.

OPTIONS

You're never going to get yourself in a spot where you'll need an electric steel cable power winch (Hardtop only) to haul yourself out, but you might want to be able to rescue some fellow offroader or clear logs and boulders from the trail. Air conditioning is a real comfort plus, on and off the pavement. A radio or stereo tape deck is good company on long trips. Free-wheeling/ locking front hubs improve gas mileage on the pavement (they're standard on the Wagon). Power steering makes a big difference when you're picking your way through the rough stuff (also standard on the Wagon). Ask your Toyota dealer for a full list of other Land Cruiser off-roading options.
